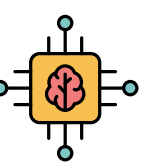

AI Launchpad: Your First Steps into an AI-Powered Career

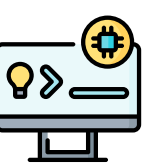

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Key Outcome:

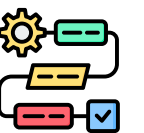
New graduates will not only understand AI basics but also gain practical, hands-on experience to market themselves as AI-literate candidates for entry-level roles.

Early to Mid-Career Professionals: Elevating Skills to Stay Ahead

AI Accelerator: Level Up Your Current Role & Future-Proof Your Career

Professionals aged 25-39 often seek ways to remain relevant and advance in their careers, especially as industries rapidly evolve. This 10-12-week workbook (3-5 hours/week) helps individuals incorporate AI into their current workflow, aiming to increase productivity by 30-50%. The goal is to identify high-impact AI skills and integrate them into daily operations, enhancing performance and positioning individuals for promotion or lateral moves.

The workbook introduces advanced AI tools like Notion AI, Grammarly, Zapier + AI, and Otter.ai to streamline tasks and optimize communication. Participants learn how to apply AI to specific job functions like content creation, data analysis, and customer engagement. Modules on collaboration and decision-making illustrate the value of AI in team settings, enhancing productivity and driving innovation. The course concludes with a capstone project where participants deliver an "AI Impact Report" for their role, reflecting on the time saved and value added by AI integration.



Key Outcome:

Mid-career professionals will master AI tools that align with their industry and job function, empowering them to perform tasks more efficiently and stay competitive in their field.

Mid-Career Switchers: Leveraging Experience in the AI Economy

AI Pivot: Leverage Your Experience in the AI Economy

For individuals aged 40-54, the challenge often lies in transitioning to new roles that leverage their years of experience while incorporating modern AI tools. This workbook guides mid-career professionals through a 12-14-week process, helping them identify transferable skills and bridge the gap between their current role and AI-enabled careers.

The course begins with a reality check on why now is the right time for a pivot, followed by an inventory of transferable skills. The AI Literacy module offers a high-level overview of AI applications relevant to experienced professionals, providing context and use cases for AI in various industries. As the course progresses, learners engage in fast-track learning with practical, hands-on short courses and build an AI-enhanced portfolio. Networking is a key focus, with activities designed to connect participants with mentors, industry peers, and AI professionals through informational interviews and virtual meetups.

The final project tasks participants with creating a 90-day, 6-month, and 12-month roadmap for their AI career pivot. They will develop a consulting pitch or outline a mentoring service, positioning themselves as thought leaders within their domain.



Key Outcome:

Mid-career switchers will gain confidence in their ability to transition into AI roles by leveraging their existing expertise and learning new, relevant skills in AI.

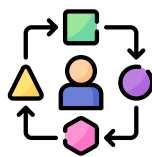


Displaced Older Workers: Embracing Lifelong Learning and AI Opportunities

AI Reboot: Turn Experience into Opportunity in the AI Era

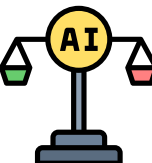
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For older workers (55+), the goal is to rebuild confidence and demonstrate that age is not a barrier to learning and adapting in the AI-driven job market. This workbook is designed to be accessible and supportive, with 12–16 weeks of content (2–4 hours/week), featuring gentle introductions to AI and step-by-step guides on how to use AI tools for both personal and professional tasks.

Older workers start by overcoming common myths about technology and embracing their years of experience as an advantage. The workbook includes simplified, analogy-based explanations of AI, allowing learners to experiment with voice-based AI tools like Siri, Google Assistant, and Microsoft Copilot. The course emphasizes AI's application in non-technical roles such as AI ethics reviewing, mentoring, and customer success. By the end of the workbook, participants will have developed a modern LinkedIn profile and recorded a short video explaining an AI concept, building their visibility and confidence.
